Robin Kramer

Robin created Next Step Farms, where special needs adults can develop daily life skills in a farm setting.

Thanks to Redstone's Community Champions program, more adults with special needs now know about Robin's Next Step Farms and the valuable life skills they can learn there. Robin shared, "Wow, just WOW!! Being a Community Champion exploded our exposure to the unknown world. Sponsorships and clientele have increased because of what Redstone promoted. Our program grew to 5 days a week and we are looking at expanding our facility."

Leo Robinson

Leo started Second Chance Deliverance and Restoration Ministries to support people struggling with addiction, poverty, and homelessness.

Leo's work at Second Chance Ministries was also elevated, especially during the colder months when the program helped keep more people warm. "The Community Champion Award certainly helped to increase our exposure to new donors. There was an increase in donations and new donors. We saw a significant increase in the number of coats we were able to donate to the schools and the Richard Showers Center."

Kaye Bough

Kaye founded Kindred Hope Rescue and Sanctuary to offer equine-assisted therapy for veterans dealing with PTSD, using rescued horses as part of their healing process.

Over in Scottsboro, Kaye's Kindred Hope Rescue and Sanctuary saw double the visitors after being featured in the program. She said, "I cannot tell you how much we appreciate Redstone Federal Credit Union's support with our endeavor."
